Role Summary:

The Physiotherapy Department's Cardiorespiratory team is involved in the treatment and rehabilitation of medical patients. In addition, we are developing physiotherapy services within the Department of Infectious Diseases.

The current physiotherapy service is primarily an inpatient service, delivered by ward based physiotherapists working as part of a multidisciplinary team (MDT).

This is a new post and St. Vincent's University Hospital has been designated as one of six sites nationally to establish a Long COVID Service. The physiotherapist will work with the MDT to develop this long COVID service and to establish other physiotherapy services to meet the cardiorespiratory and rehabilitation needs of both medical inpatients and outpatients.

This will include the management and rehabilitation of patients with chronic infections including those recovering from acute infections. There will be an opportunity to develop physiotherapy services for people living with HIV with a focus on older adults in the HIV population.

You will be joining a dynamic team with great opportunities for new and collaborative research.

- Develop and administer the highest quality of service by identifying and implementing operational procedures in line with best practice standards.
- Keep up to date with new developments, skills and technology to ensure continuing competence in the job.
- Enhance skills in order to initiate and respond to changes in the work environment as additional roles may be demanded e.g. data analysis, clinical audit and research.

- To lead and co-ordinate the service in co-operation with the other senior physiotherapists and the Physiotherapist Managers.
- Participate in the management of the Physiotherapy Service as a member of the Senior Physiotherapy Management team in co-operation with the Physiotherapist Managers.
- To create and promote good working relationships with all staff through open communication.

- To contribute to and participate in the staff induction, staff appraisal and in service training programmes.
- To actively participate in and promote continuing education and research activities consistent with the position.
- To produce a service report for the Hospital Annual Report
- To maintain and update an asset register of appropriate equipment and resources in conjunction with the Asset Register of the hospital
- Maintain appropriate records and statistics sufficient for organisational and legal purposes.
- To regularly review and update the Physiotherapy Policy, Procedure and Guideline documents.
- To be responsible for overseeing equipment safety tests, both electrical and non-electrical, in accordance with the Physiotherapy Department's Safety Policy.
- To ensure that all new electrical equipment has been approved by the Department of Clinical Engineering prior to use in the Physiotherapy Department
- To participate in the on-call with stand-by rota.

Staff Management:

- To lead by example a professional, dedicated and punctual team.
- To encourage professional development of team members at undergraduate, graduate and post graduate level through promotion of self-learning, formal courses and in-service training.
- To participate in the education and supervision of undergraduate and postgraduate students.
- To ensure staff compliance with the Physiotherapy Department's policy on BLS and Moving and Handling training programmes.

Health and Safety:

- To ensure that effective safety procedures are in place to comply not only with the Health, Safety and Welfare at Work Act, but also within the spirit of the Hospital's mission, vision and values.
- To be conversant with and uphold the Fire Safety regulations and the Major Disaster Plan.

• To ensure that faulty equipment is immediately removed from the treatment area and restored to safe use as promptly as possible.

• In co-operation with the Physiotherapist Managers participate in the control of expenditure and management of departmental budgets, including a planned programme for replacing capital equipment.

Particulars of Office:

The appointment is: Whole-time, Permanent and Pensionable

Annual Salary: €57,450 to €67,645 pro rata dependent on previous Public Health Sector experience.

These particulars are subject to change in line with overall public pay policy.

<u>Candidates should expect to be appointed on the minimum of the salary range and in accordance</u> with the Department of Finance guidelines.

Probationary Period: The appointee shall hold office for a probationary period of six months – The Hospital's Probation and Induction policy will apply.

Pension Scheme: The candidate will be entered into one of the Hospital Superannuation Schemes.

Working Hours: The person appointed will work a basic 35 hour week. You will be required to work the agreed roster / on call arrangements advised to you by your line manager. Your contracted hours of work are liable to change between the hours of 8am – 8pm over seven days to meet the requirements for the extended day services in accordance with the terms of the Framework Agreement. (Reference HSE HR Circular 003/2009). Flexibility on hours of attendance in response to service needs will be a requirement.

Annual leave entitlement: 29 working days per annum pro rata. Annual leave accrued must be taken within the duration of the contract or calendar year and as agreed between the candidate and the Head of Department.

Appendix 1 - ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA/ QUALIFICATIONS:

1. <u>Statutory Registration</u>,

Category 1 applicants (Section 91 – Existing Practitioners)

Individuals who qualified before 30 September 2016 and have been engaged in the practice of the profession in the Republic of Ireland for a <u>minimum of 2 years</u> fulltime (or an aggregate of 2 years fulltime), between 30th September 2011 and 30th September 2016 are considered to be Section 91 applicants under the Health and Social Care Professionals Act 2005.

To be considered for HSE posts Section 91 applicants must:

a) (i) Hold a qualification recognised by the Physiotherapists Registration Board at CORU: See <u>http://coru.ie/uploads/documents/Physiotherapist_Qualifications_S38_HSE_List.pdf</u>

And

(ii) Be registered on the Physiotherapists Register maintained by the Physiotherapists Registration Board at CORU

Or

(iii) Hold a qualification awarded outside of Ireland which has been recognised (along with evidence of that recognition) by the Irish Society of Chartered Physiotherapists or the Physiotherapists Registration Board at CORU.

And

(iii) Applicants who satisfy the conditions set out in Section 91 of the Health and Social Care Professionals Act 2005, (see note 1 below*), must submit proof of application for registration with the Physiotherapists Registration Board at CORU. The acceptable proof is correspondence from the Physiotherapists Registration Board at CORU confirming their application for registration as a Section 91 applicant.

And

(iv) Candidates must have three years full time (or an aggregate of three years full time) post qualification clinical experience.
